

- Increasing the number of valuable community wardens from 20 to 36
- Improved use and locations of street lighting and CCTV
- Seeking a review of school and road crossings to safeguard our children and pedestrian and less mobile.




- The Borough Local Plan is a key document that defines where and what sort of development can happen. It should be upgraded to protect the green belt, integrate with local services and serve the needs of residents & local businesses such as **protecting our garden centres**
- Protecting green spaces and vulnerable sites e.g. HA11, Sutherland Grange Nature Reserve, Whiteleys, The Manor
- Championing the reduction of single use plastics across the Borough and Council supply chains
- Improving education and opportunities for residents and businesses to better their environmental achievements

Restoring Well Being & Dignity

Young or old, people, community and family are at the centre of what we do and how we live. We will continue to seek ways to improve your quality of life including;

- Boosting affordable social housing stock
- Creating an attractive, multi feature, community hub for old and young; a **“Wyevalles plus”**
- Encouraging healthy lifestyle e.g. outdoor gym, cycling, walking, rambling, river activities
- Investing in Youth Programmes

Better Governance & Accountability

Democracy and open, honest local government have never been at greater risk than now.

We want to make sure that things are done in the interest of all people.

We will continue to hold the Council to account to;

- Monitor and help ensure sound, unbiased planning decisions based on planning documents
- Make every effort to work collaboratively with all parties in the interests of all the residents of our town
- Empower the council employees, on whose professional qualifications and experience we should



be relying. After all, they are the experts.

- Work for greater transparency and consultation between Council and residents about long term investment decisions and its impact on funding of our Council
- Seek fair funding for all schools
- Continue to hold quarterly surgeries in convenient locations; making ourselves available to residents to help with their queries and concerns with the Council.

Promoting Local Businesses

With Brexit looming large and high streets under increasing pressure, we will look to improve and regenerate the vibrancy of our beautiful town. We see opportunities to

- Improve parking facilities, including park and ride, increasing accessibility and footfall for local businesses
- Reduce business rates for environmentally & transport friendly businesses
- Foster relationships between business and our young people to create more opportunities for them and the businesses

Improving Roads & Transport

Joined up thinking is needed more than ever with a multitude of changes and legislation affecting our roads and transport facilities. We will look to;

- Continue liaising with bus companies, residents & businesses to improve services
- Secure cycle parking
- A strategic review of pavements & traffic management plans, fully integrated with transport and community plans
- Improve road repairs processes and parking policy
